As of 2017, the global movement for gender equality has not incorporated the proposition of genders besides women and men, or gender identities outside of the gender binary.

Education inequalities:

Schooling:

India is on target to meet its Millennium Development Goal of gender parity in education by 2015.

UNICEF's measure of attendance rate and Gender Equality in Education Index (GEEI) capture the quality of education.

Despite some gains, India needs to triple its rate of improvement to reach GEEI score of 95% by 2015 under the Millennium Development Goals. In rural India girls continue to be less educated than the boys.

According to a 1998 report by U.S.

Department of Commerce, the chief barrier to female education in India are inadequate school facilities (such as sanitary facilities), shortage of female teachers and gender bias in curriculum (majority of the female characters being depicted as weak and helpless vs. strong, adventurous, and intelligent men with high prestige jobs)
